Class puts its pennies on line

Ayala High's class of 2009 will try to make the record books today (April 4) by lining up a mile of pennies, more than 84,000 coins, in less than two hours, 23 minutes and one second. The event will begin at 9 a.m. in the school's gym at 14255 Peyton Drive, Chino Hills (between Grand and Eucalyptus avenues).

The high school seniors have been collecting pennies since December, reaching their goal of 125,000 pennies on March 20.

The class of 2009 will donate the money to **Let It Be Foundation**, Invisible Children, Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer **Foundation** and St. Jude Hospital.

The existing record, for laying down 84,480 pennies in a mile, belongs to a group in the United Kingdom. Guinness Book of Record rules state that only eight people may place pennies at a time, and all the currency has to **be** the same.
